- Keith Sharisky asked parliamentarian Barb Thaler if the EC has the power to tell the districts that they must replace the projectors. Barb Thaler noted that she would review the rules in greater detail and report back at a later time.

# **Conference Report**

- 414 attendees
- Looking at approximately \$92,000 income at present with between \$15,000 and \$30,000 in profit projected based on outstanding known charges. More to follow as the conference is closed out and final bills are figured in.
- As a side note it was noted that the association used 67 gallons of coffee Friday and 69 on Saturday (at \$20 per gallon).
- A big thank you was extended to the IC Society for sponsoring "the drug lady" for preconference. It was estimated that over 250 people were in attendance for her presentations.
- Sue Schurmann's Future Planning
